Are there any specific areas of sin that you grow weary of fighting against? How can the truth that God will remove all sin encourage you in your battle against this sin?

How might seeing how awful sin is in your own life lead you to see how amazing God's grace is in Christ? What can you do to remind yourself of this the next time you are confronted with the problem of your own sin?
