What are some of the ways we associate comfort with good circumstances? How might we especially do this at Christmas? What's the danger of looking for comfort in our circumstances?

What comfort can we find in the fact that Jesus is our older brother?

• Why is the truth that Jesus is not ashamed to call us brothers and sisters good news? How is that especially good news when we feel ashamed or weak?

Read 1 Peter 4:13 (and Philippians 3:10). Why would we rejoice when we experience suffering? What comfort can we find in Jesus as our older brother in the midst of suffering?

What are reasons that we might fear death? What are types of death (losses) we might fear in this life? How does Jesus empty death (in all its forms) of its power?

How have you experienced the comfort of Jesus as you've walked through the 'worst' in your own life?

In what ways is Jesus a merciful and faithful high priest to us?

Why is it good news that Jesus understands us and all that we might go through in this life?

What are some of the things that would keep you from going to Jesus seeking his help for whatever you are facing?

Where do you most need to experience the comfort of Jesus this Christmas? What comfort do you most need him to provide you with?

How has experiencing Jesus' comfort in your own life helped you to be better at offering comfort to other people around you?
