What are some of the ways you might think or feel that you are "not doing enough for God"? How can we differentiate obeying God out of love and gratitude from obeying God out of an attempt to add something to Jesus' sacrifice?

What are some ways (or areas in your life) you might struggle with a guilty conscience? How can you "replay" the sacrifice of Jesus and remember that his blood has set you free?

How can knowing that God already sees us as perfect help us as we seek to grow to be more like Christ?

What are some of the ways we can be "eagerly waiting" for Christ's return? What are some reasons that might keep us from "eagerly waiting for his return?"

What are some of the songs we sing that speak of Jesus' blood? Make a list and take some time to listen through them this week and pay close attention to the words.
