## God is forever committed to you in life and death!

When was a time in your own life when you've been confronted with your own mortality (a funeral, death of someone else you loved, a diagnosis or accident, a close call, etc)? What was that experience like? What effect does it have on you when you come in close contact with death?

If you knew you were going to die next week, how would you want to live in the upcoming week? What would you do the same, what would you do differently?



Read Matthew 10:28-31. What difference can it make in your own life when you know and believe that your life and death are held securely in God's hands and that you are immortal until he decides that you die?

What is a reoccurring fear that shows up in your life right now? What would it look like for you to "talk back" that fear and remind yourself that you are held in your Father's hands? (Take a minute as a CARE Group and just pray over some of these fears together).

What are the aspects of dying that are fearful, sad, or overwhelming? What are the aspects of death that make it feel like a tragedy? What truths or passages in the Bible most help us to see death in a new light?

Do you believe it's true to say that the day we die will actually be the greatest day of our lives? Why or why not? How can this shape when and how you think about death?

As you think back over the Last Seven Sayings of Jesus (can find them all in order here: Luke 23:34; Luke 23:43; John 19:26-27; Matthew 27:46; John 19:28; John 19:30; Luke 23:46) which one has been the most impactful to you? Why?

What's one thing that has stuck out to you most as we've gone through this series together? What would you hope to remember from it?
