- As you look back at Keystone's history (or just your own life) what are some moments or ways you
 can see that God worked powerfully by his Spirit to do what you couldn't do?
- If the Holy Spirit is really at work accomplishing and doing the things we can't do, how could that change how you approach Sunday Mornings, CARE Groups, or any other time of gathering together?
