Think about this...

- What did Jesus mean by Matthew 6:14-15? Can a believer lose his/her salvation by refusing to forgive someone? Why, why not? And most of all, why do you think Jesus even said this?
- If you've refused to forgive a particular person, have you thought about why that is? Do you wrestle with the "I'm Better" Syndrome? Privately rehearse the five worst things you think you've ever done. In your mind, is what the other person did to you worse? What do you think God would say about that?

• Since marriage is the closest human relationship that exists—and the one in which two people spend more time rubbing shoulders with each other than anyone else, sins and lesser offences will be both frequent and intensely felt. If you're married, how big has your sack containing remembered past offenses, become? Which ones do you bring up when the two of you are quarreling? What needs to be discussed with your spouse, and what needs to be buried beneath the blanket of forgiveness?
