Big Idea: If we don't see ourselves as the thief on the cross, we will not find ourselves in Heaven!

What are the truths about Jesus that you think a person needs to believe in order to be saved? What did the thief on the cross know and believe about Jesus? Does that inform, change, or confirm what you think a person needs to believe about Jesus to be saved?

What does fully trusting in Jesus for salvation look like?

If you could go to heaven, but Jesus wouldn't be there would you still want to go? Why or why not?

With your CARE group take a moment to talk about and rejoice in the salvation Jesus gives to us freely through faith.
